The United Irish League was the constituency organisation of the Irish Parliamentary Party. North Kilkenny was one of the three constituencies in the county. This extract from the Kilkenny Journal gives the names of the various branches. Most of the report is omitted here.

The branches represented at the quarterly meeting of the North Kilkenny Executive were: Clara, Danesfort, Threecastles, Castlewarren, Tullaroan, Gathabawn, Grane, St. Patrick's (city) and Lisdowney. There is no mention in this report of Castlecomer, Urlingford, Freshford or Ballyragget which were all in the constituency. Perhaps they were not represented. Castlecomer certainly had a branch.
