

O'HANRAHAN, Jim: Inistiogue, Co. Kilkenny. I.R.A. Commandant active in the Kilkenny area. Arrested in November 1920 when Ernie O'Malley (*q.v.*) was discovered in his home during his organisational tour of that area.

BEALEN, Patrick: Loan, Castlecomer, Co. Kilkenny. His body was found in the cellar of the public house where he worked at 177 North King St after Easter Week. A Coroner's Jury's verdict that he had died of wounds inflicted by soldiers was considered by commentators to be unsatisfactory. (See Healy, James)

BRENNAN, Richard: Knockanure, Co. Kilkenny. Vice-Commandant Ninth Kilkenny Battalion I.R.A. Led Sinnots' Cross ambush near Mooncoin, June 1921.

BRYAN, Dan: Dunbell, Co. Kilkenny. While a medical student, joined 'C' Company Fourth Dublin Battalion in 1917. As a result of participation in raids, armed patrols and observation work, he was appointed Assistant Battalion Intelligence Officer in January 1921 when Joe Kinsella became involved in grenade manufacturing. With Battalion Commandant Sean Dowling, Company Captain Sean McCurtain of 'G' Company, Company Captain F. X. Coughlan of 'E' Company and the Battalion Intelligence Section, his activities included the correlation of Intelligence from Tommy Daly (*q.v.*) at Kildare St Club.

CLEAR, Frank: Coolcullen, Co. Kilkenny. Active organiser of Coolbawn ambush of 1921 when intending I.R.A. ambushers were themselves set upon by Crown Forces.

COMERFORD, James: Coolraheen, Coon, Co. Kilkenny. Took part in the Coolbawn ambush near Castlecomer 18 June 1921. Held hostage during Uskerty Wood ambush May 1921.

O'DWYER, George: Captain Cionn Company I.R.A. Kilkenny 1918. Commander of Flying Column 1920. Commandant Kilkenny Brigade 1921. Led the Uskerty Wood ambush 2 May 1921.

O'DWYER, Liam: Eyeries, Co. Cork. Mobilised during Easter Week Rebellion. Prominent in organising and training in Eyeries, Lauragh, Tahilla, Ardgroam and other areas. Led in the crovane Coastguard Station and barracks. Led in the Cork and Wormwood...
